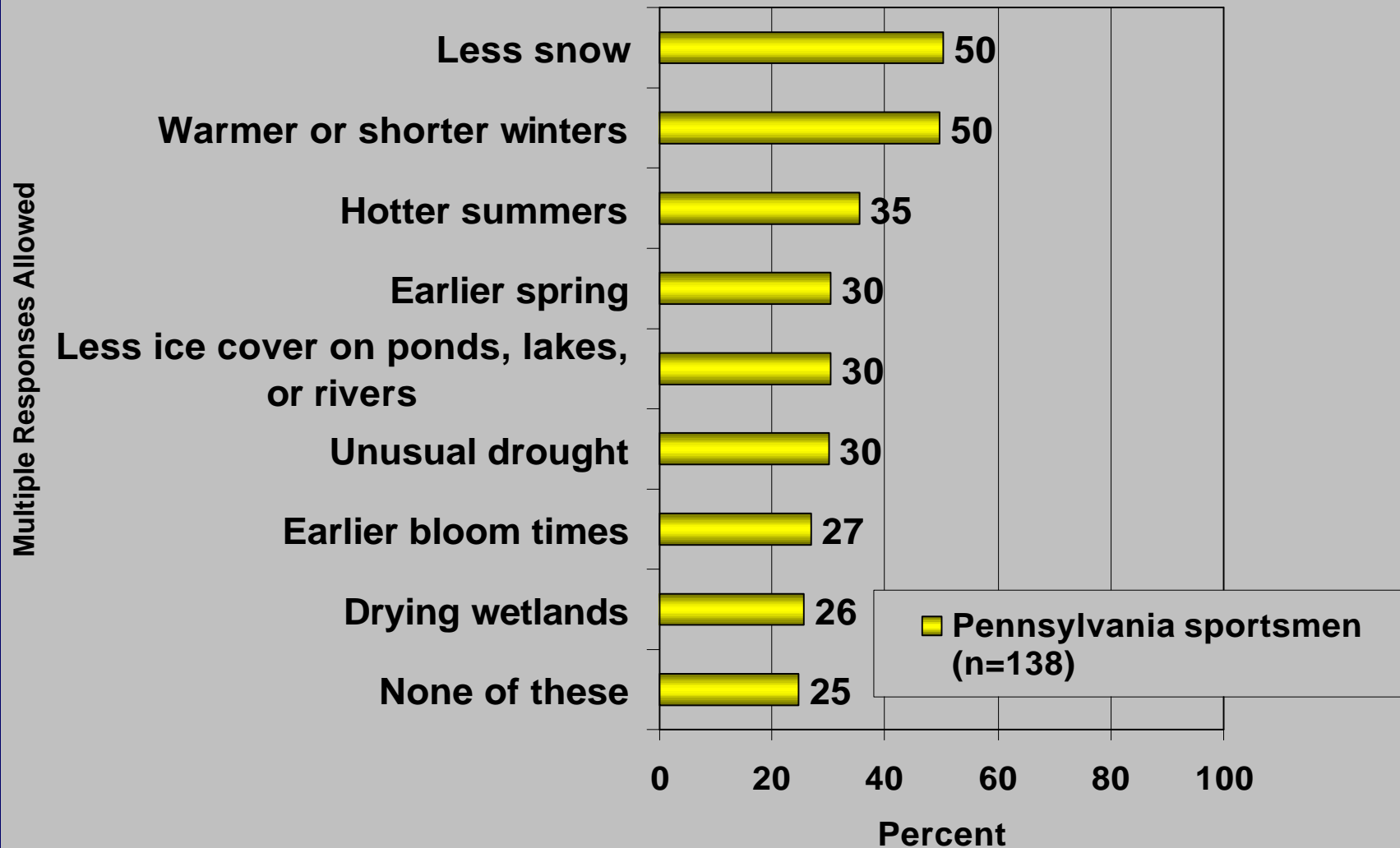
Methodology

- Telephone survey of Pennsylvania resident sportsmen (hunters and anglers)
- Conducted March – April 2006
- $n = 306$
- Results reported at 95% confidence interval
- Sampling error is at most +/- 5.6 percentage points

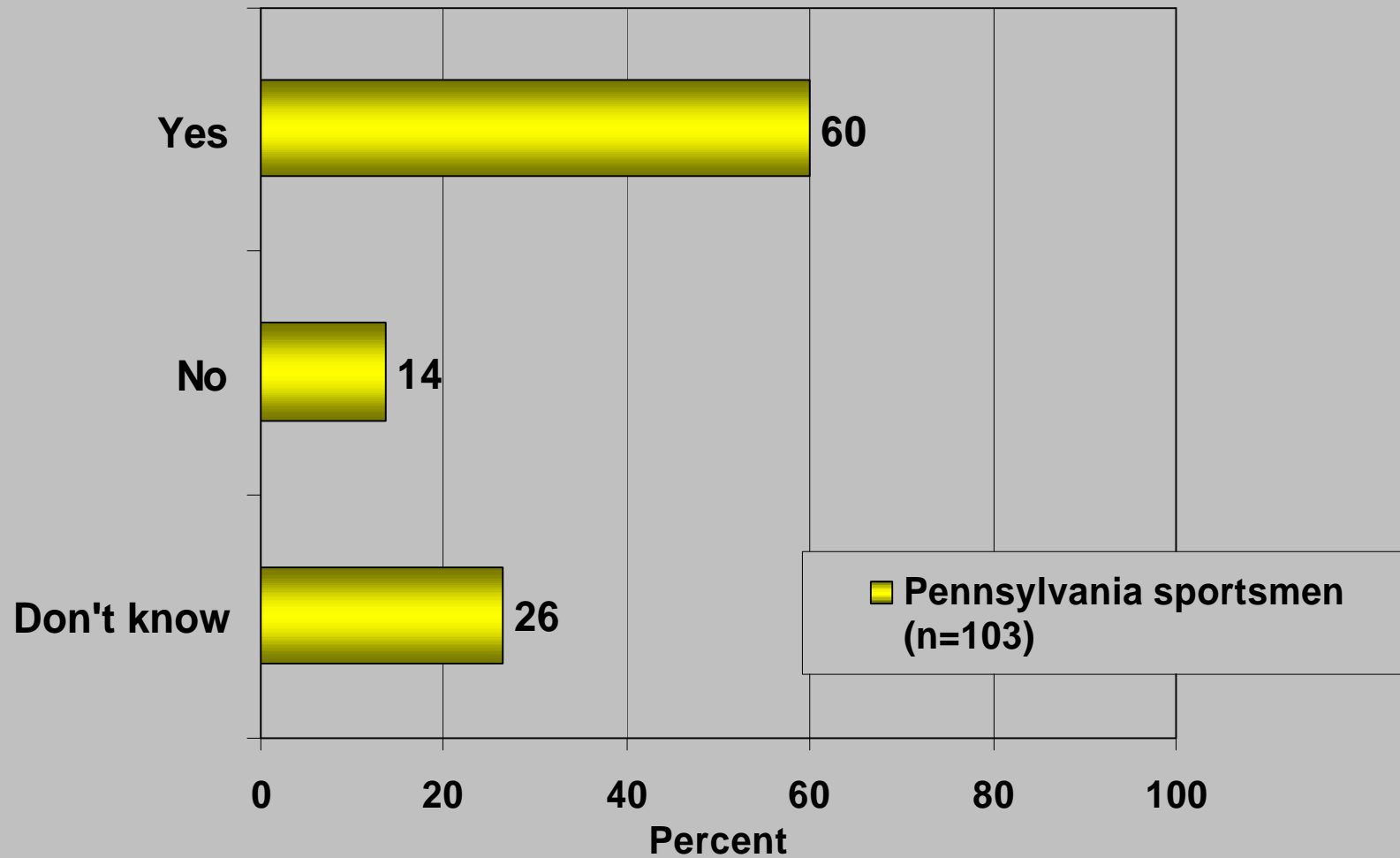
Profile of Pennsylvania Sportsmen

- 78% Male
- 41% Conservative
- 36% Moderate
- 11% Liberal
- 37% Republican
- 34% Democrat
- 48% (of those who voted) voted for George W. Bush in the 2004 Presidential election

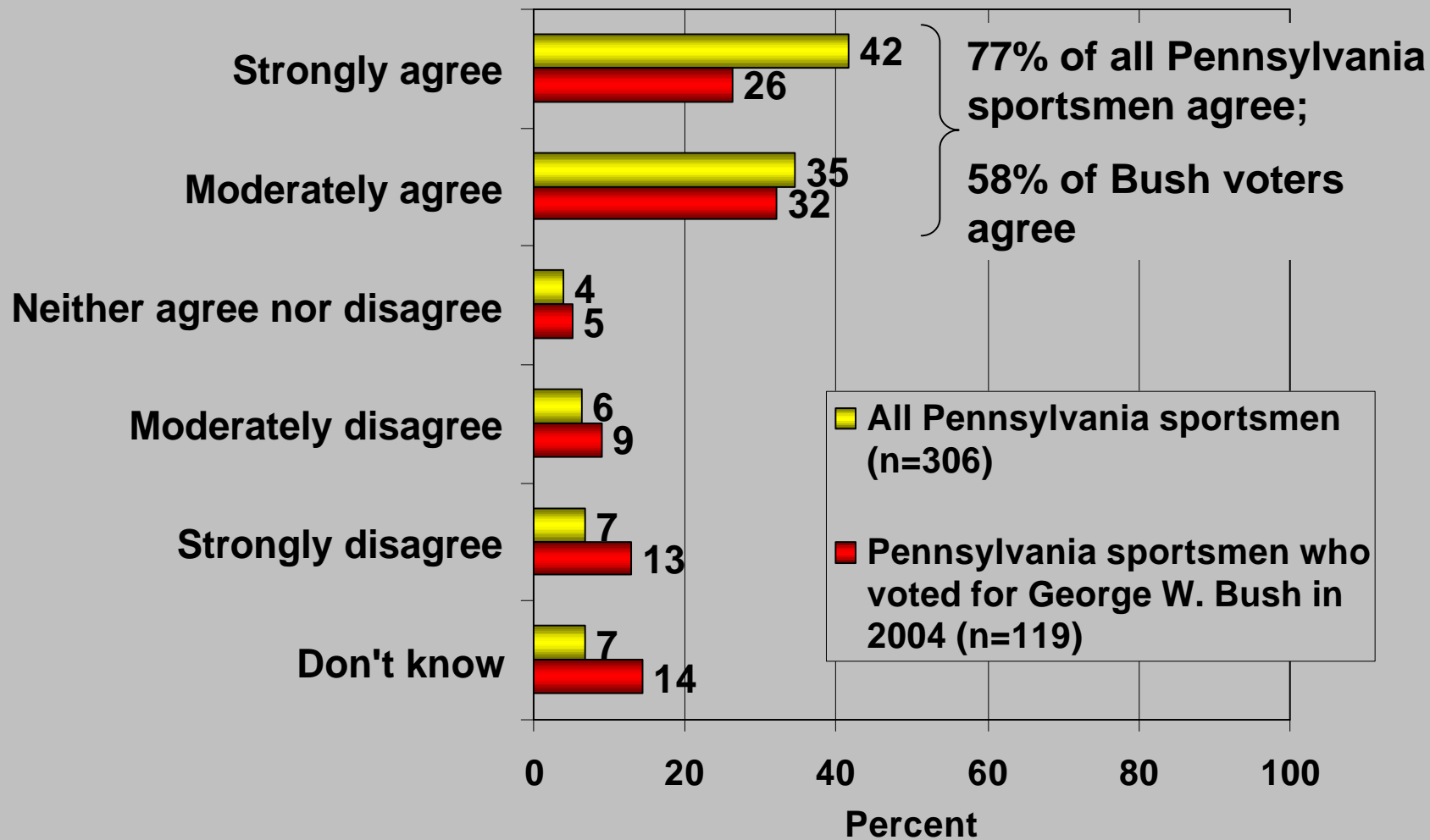
Have you observed any of the following conditions where you live?



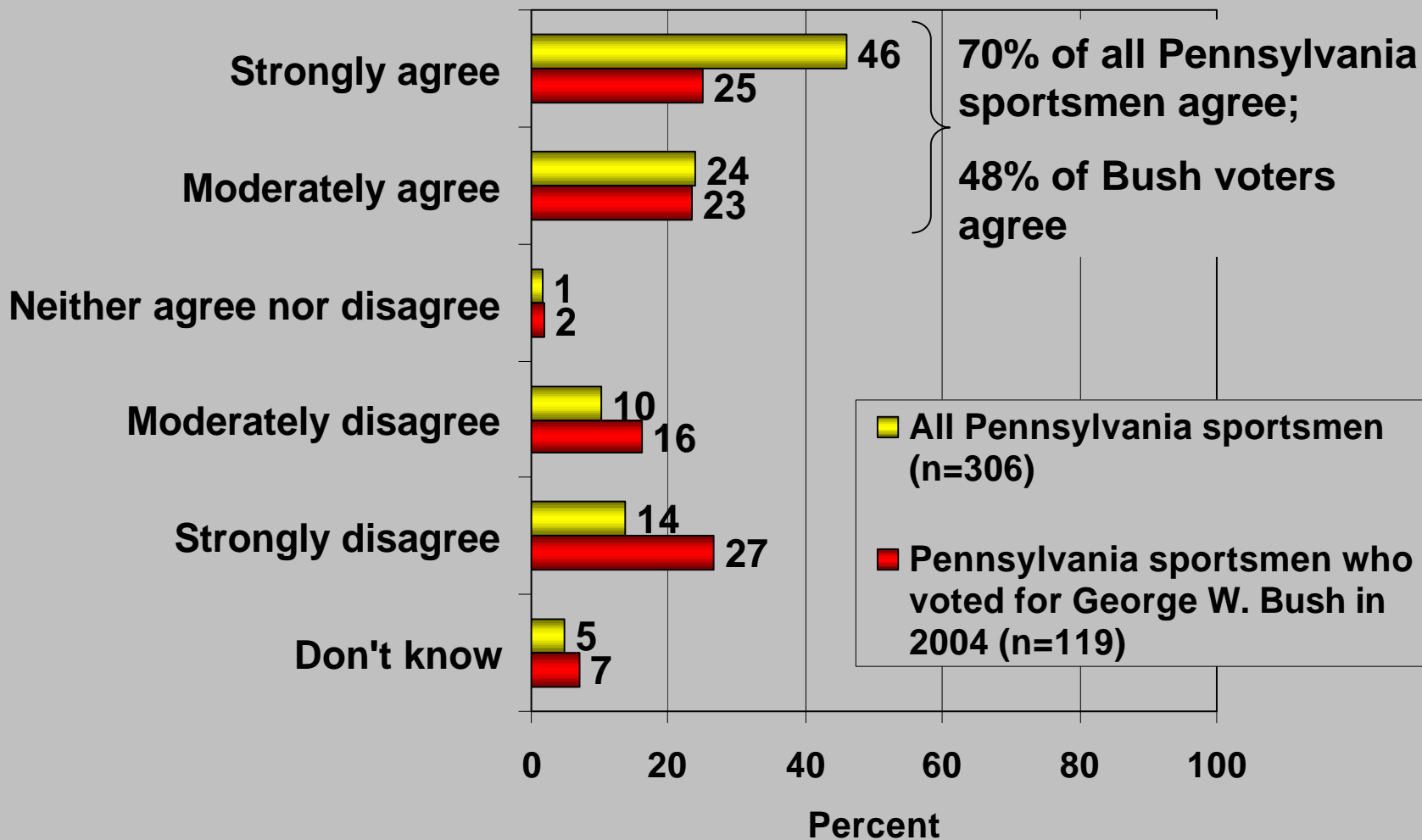
Do you believe that the condition(s) that you have observed are related to global warming? (Of those who observed at least one of the conditions.)



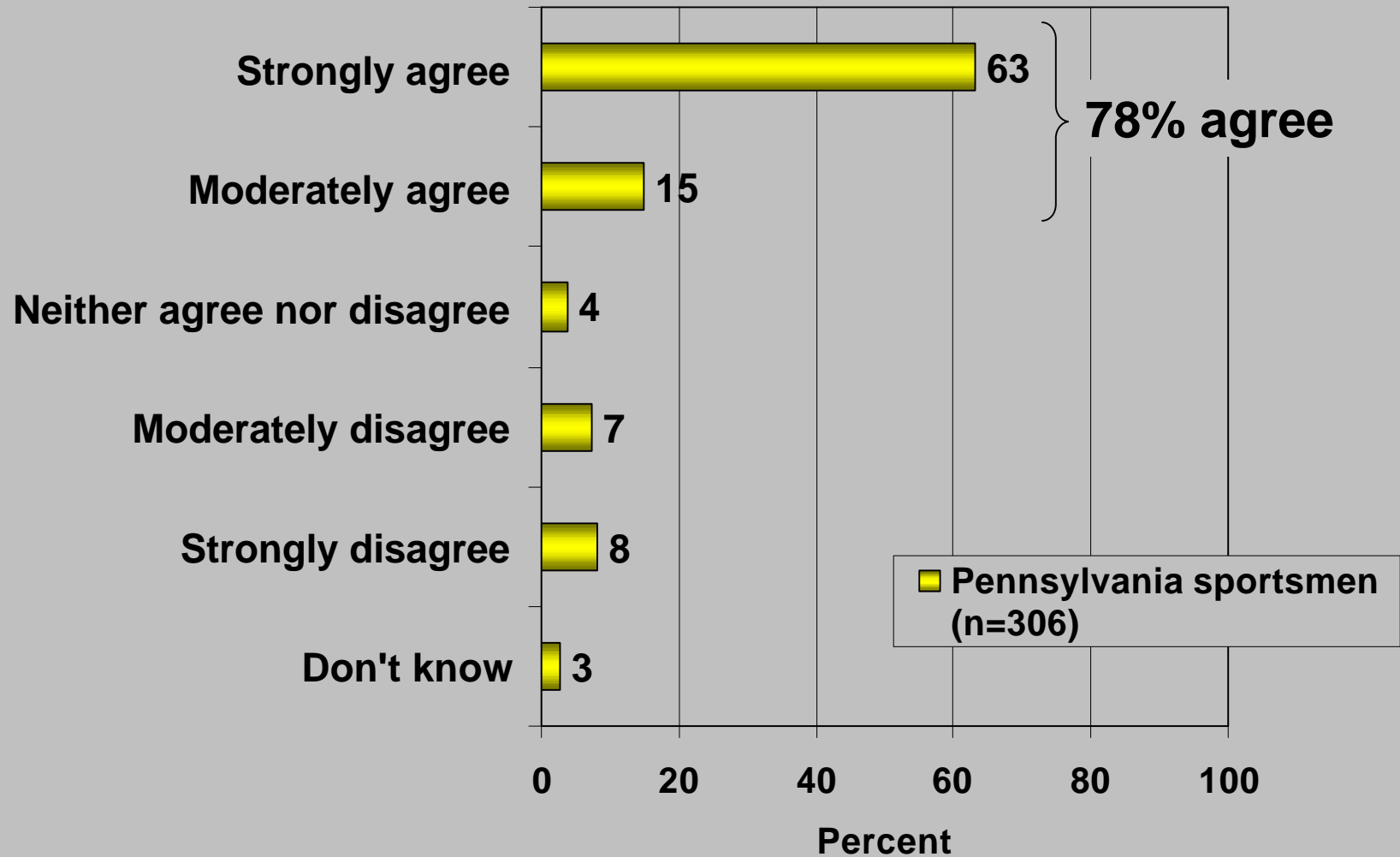
Global warming is defined as the rise in temperature of the Earth's atmosphere. Do you agree or disagree that global warming is currently occurring?



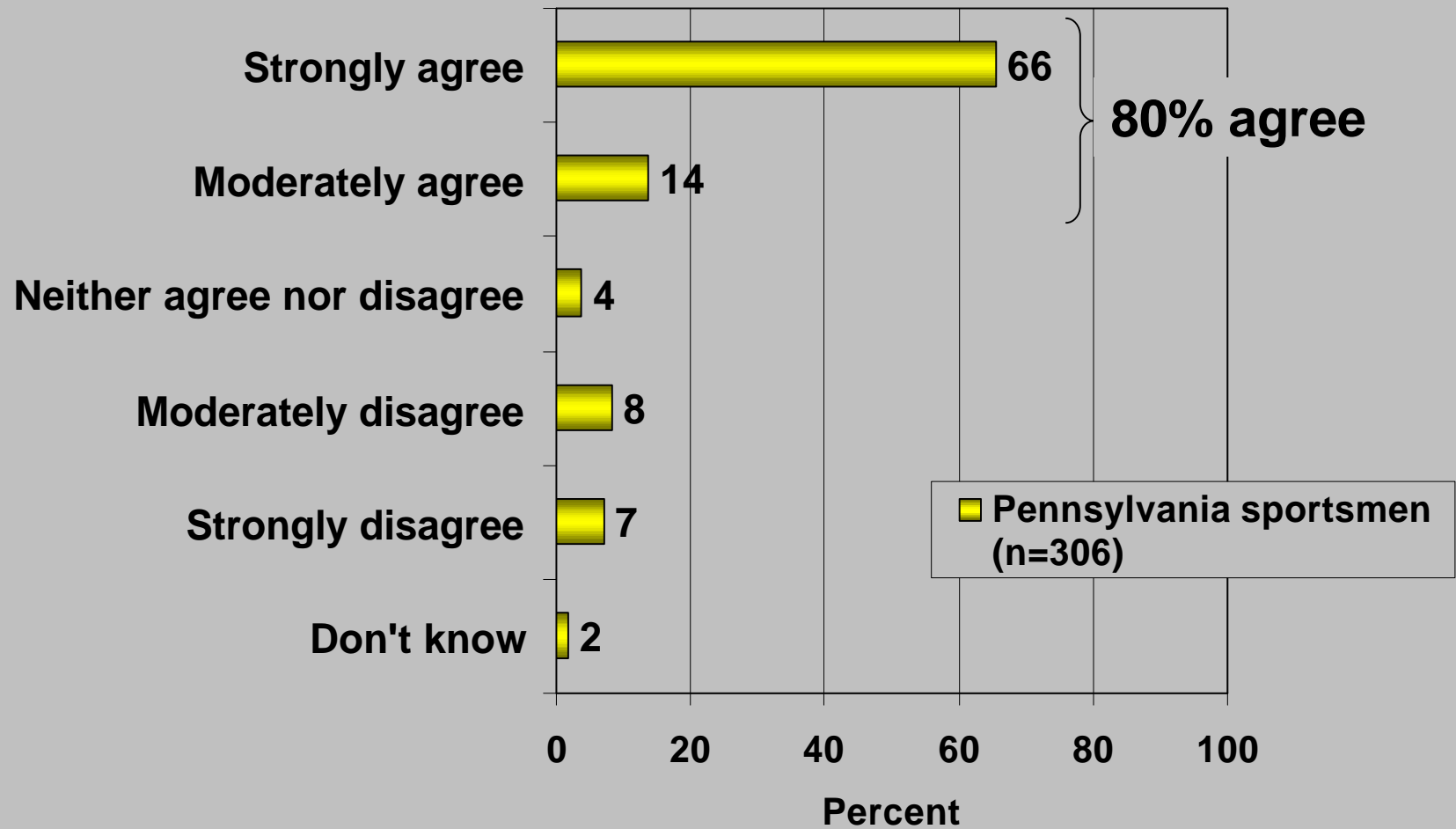
Global warming is an urgent problem requiring immediate action. (Do you agree or disagree with this statement?)



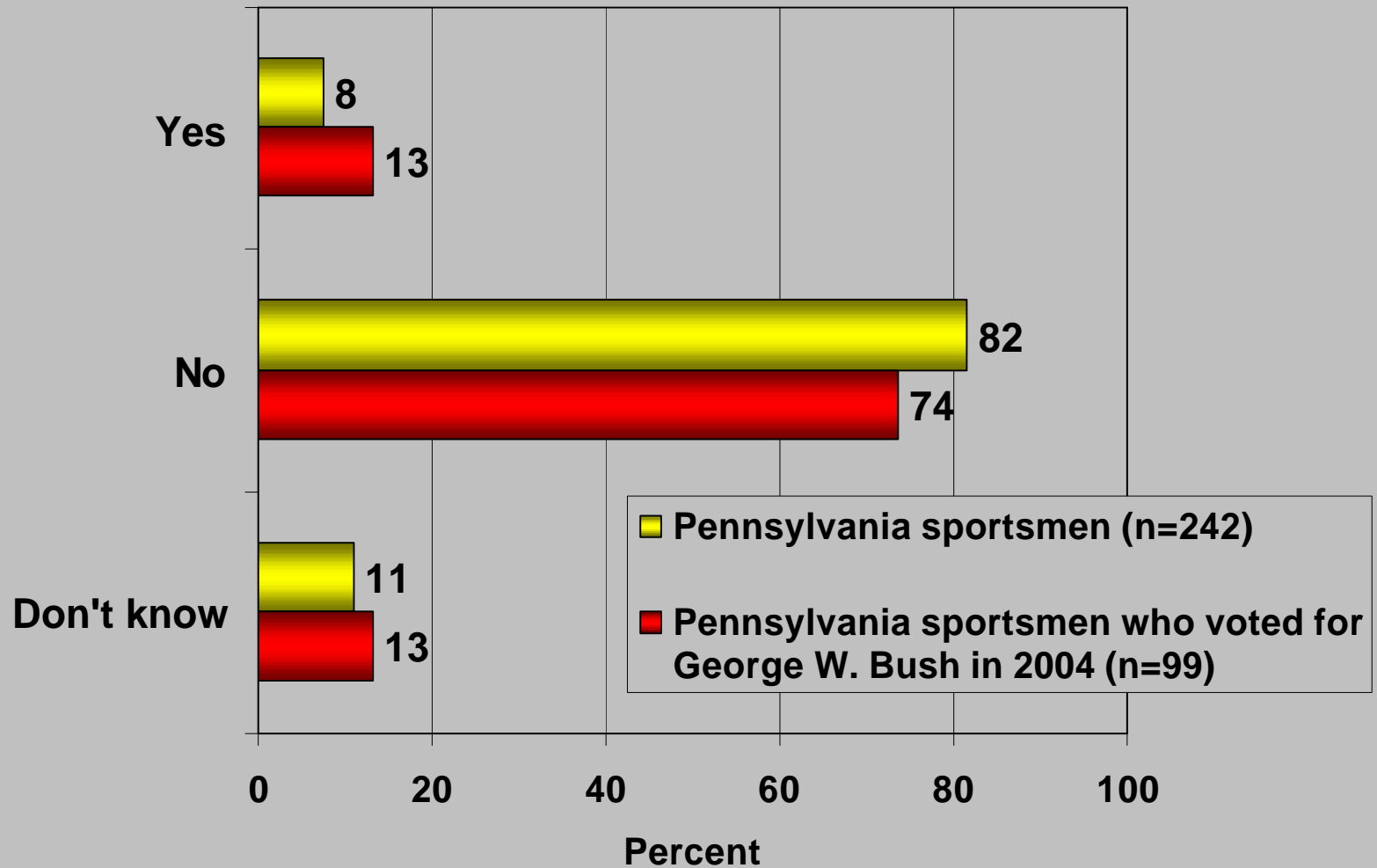
The U.S. should be a world leader in addressing global warming. (Do you agree or disagree with this statement?)



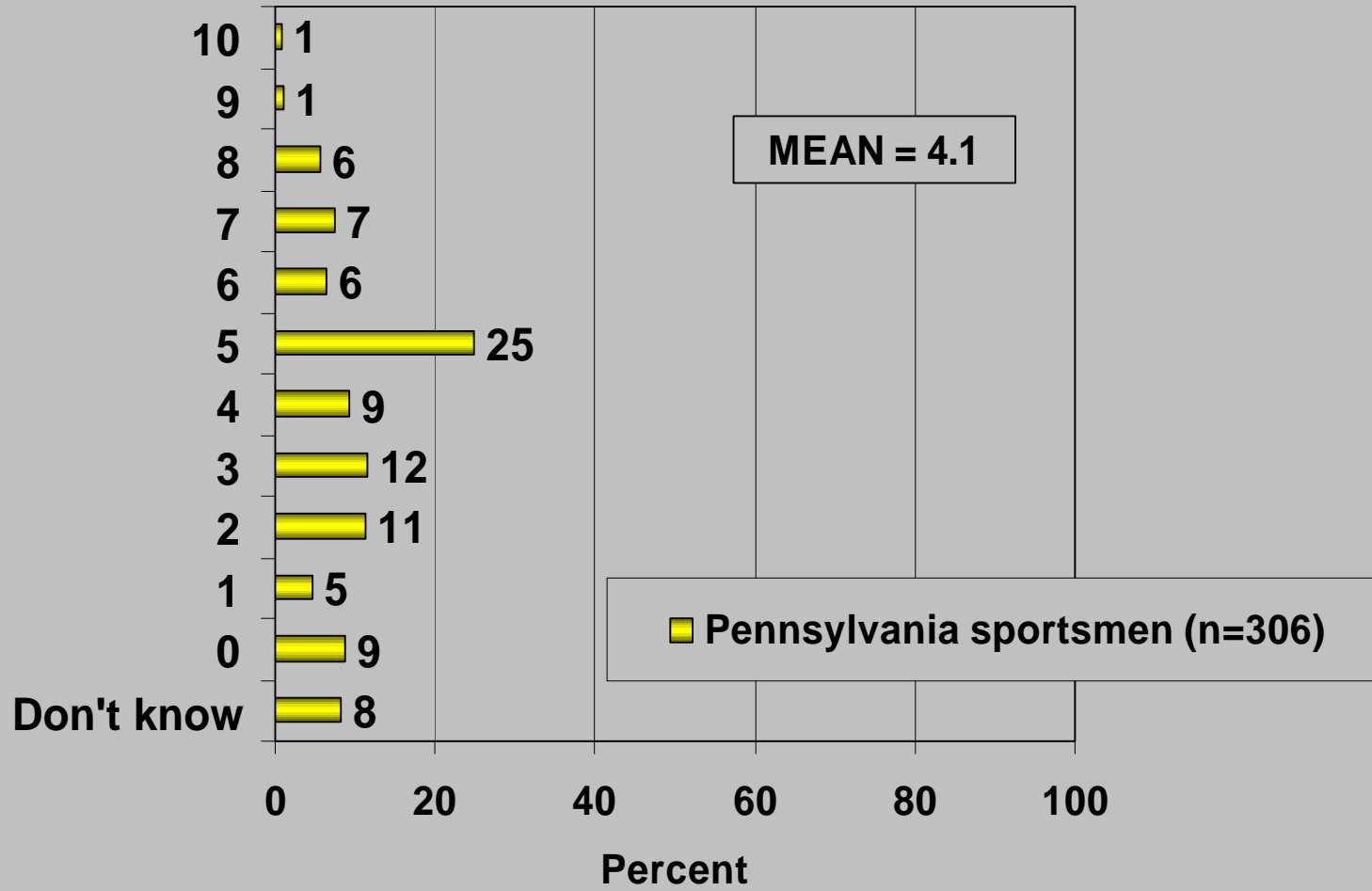
President Bush said in his State of the Union address that "America is addicted to oil". Do you agree or disagree with this statement?



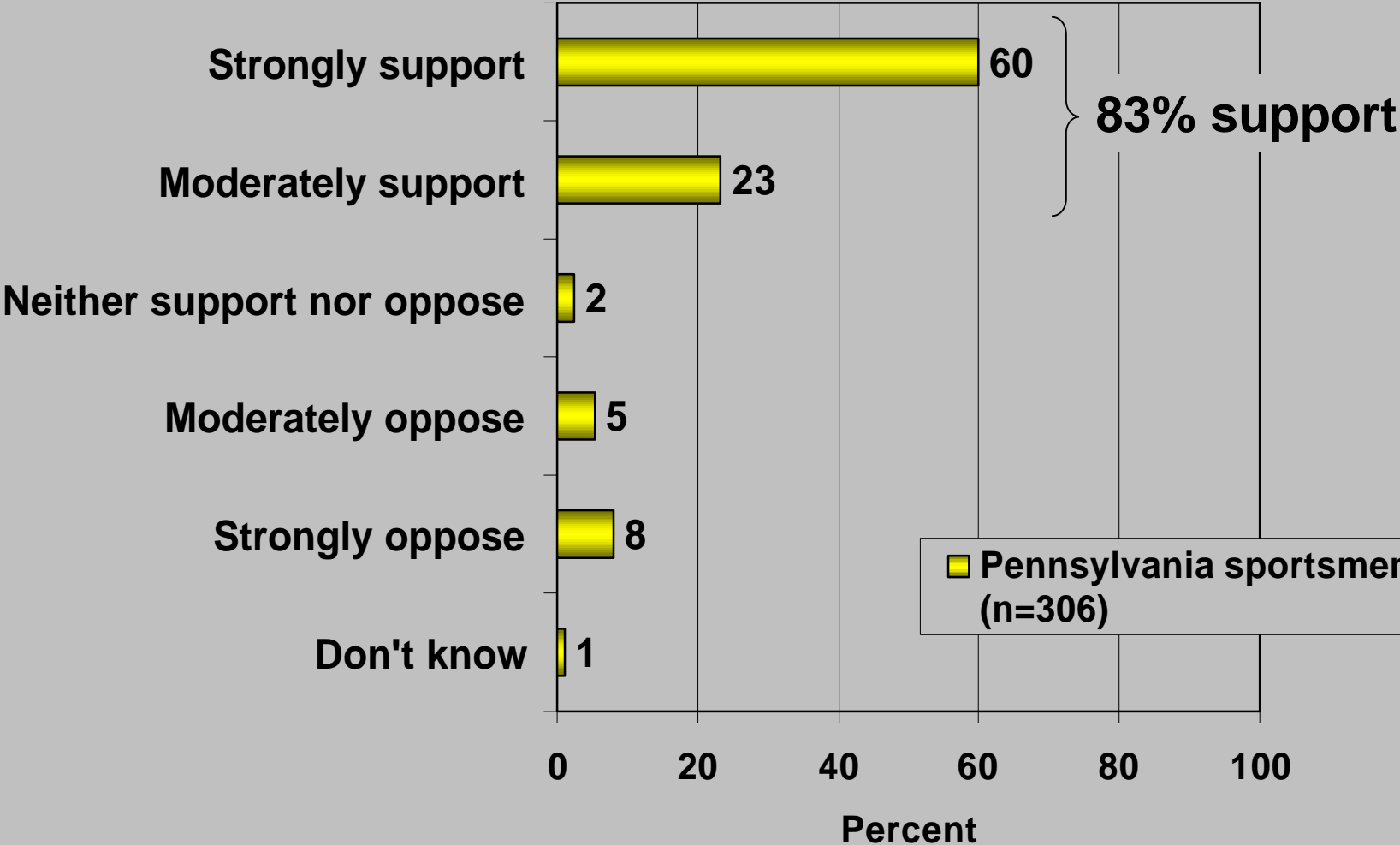
Are the Administration and Congress doing enough to break America's addiction to oil? (Asked of those who agreed that America is addicted to oil.)

Do you support or oppose Pennsylvania joining efforts with other states to reduce global warming?

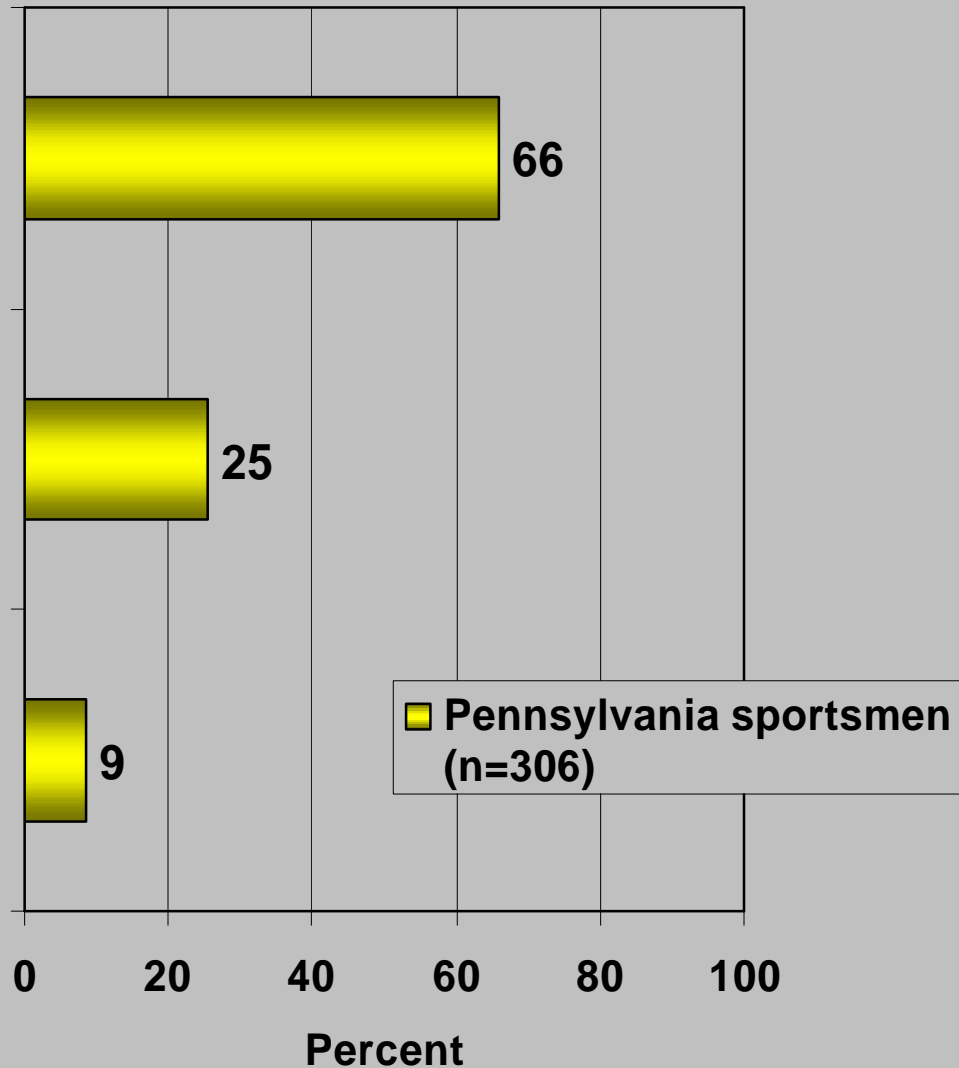


Which candidate do you prefer?

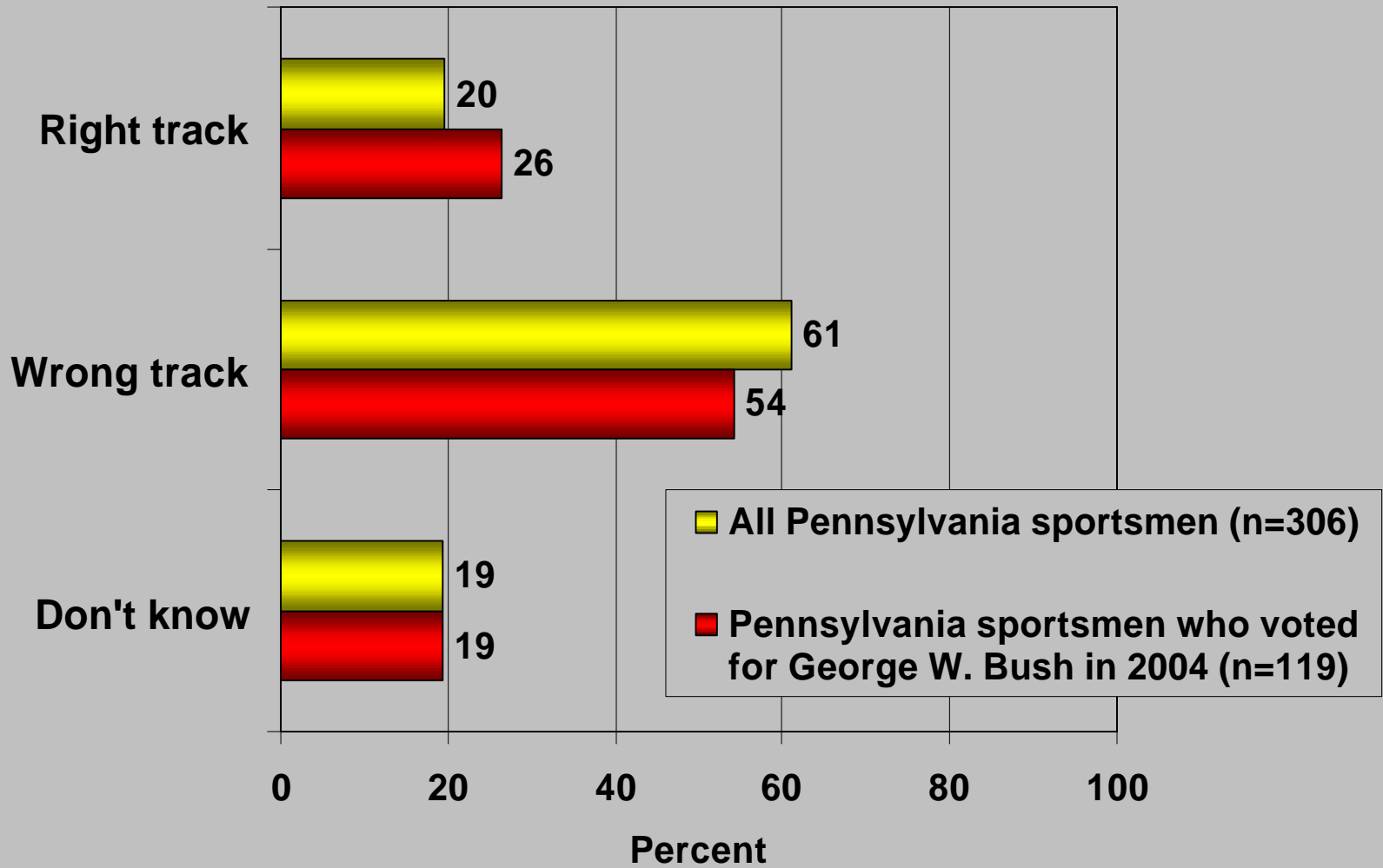
Candidate who believes we must take action now to reduce pollution contributing to global warming and supports strong laws

Candidate who believes more study is needed on global warming and believes there should be only voluntary responses rather than government regulation

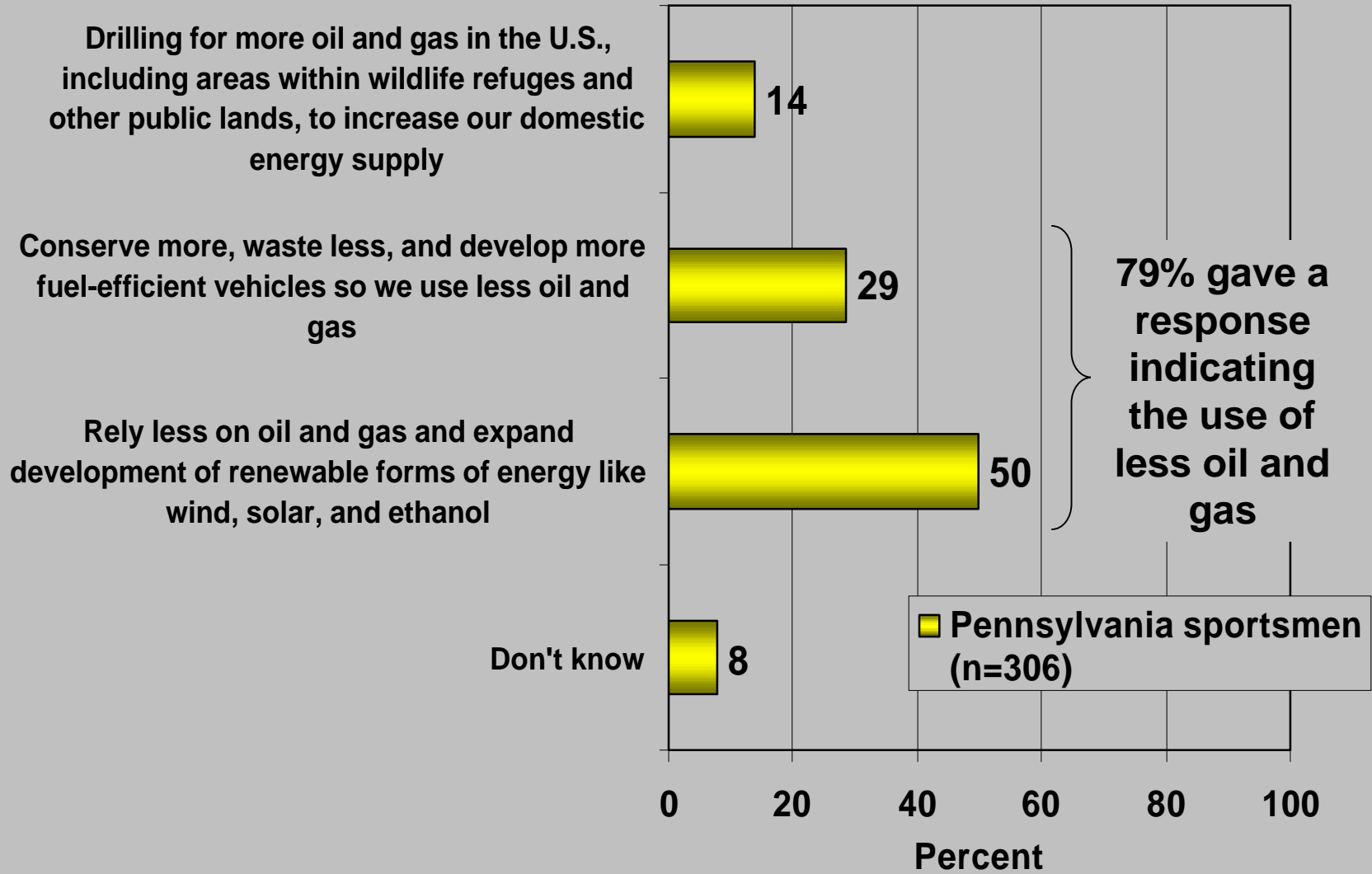

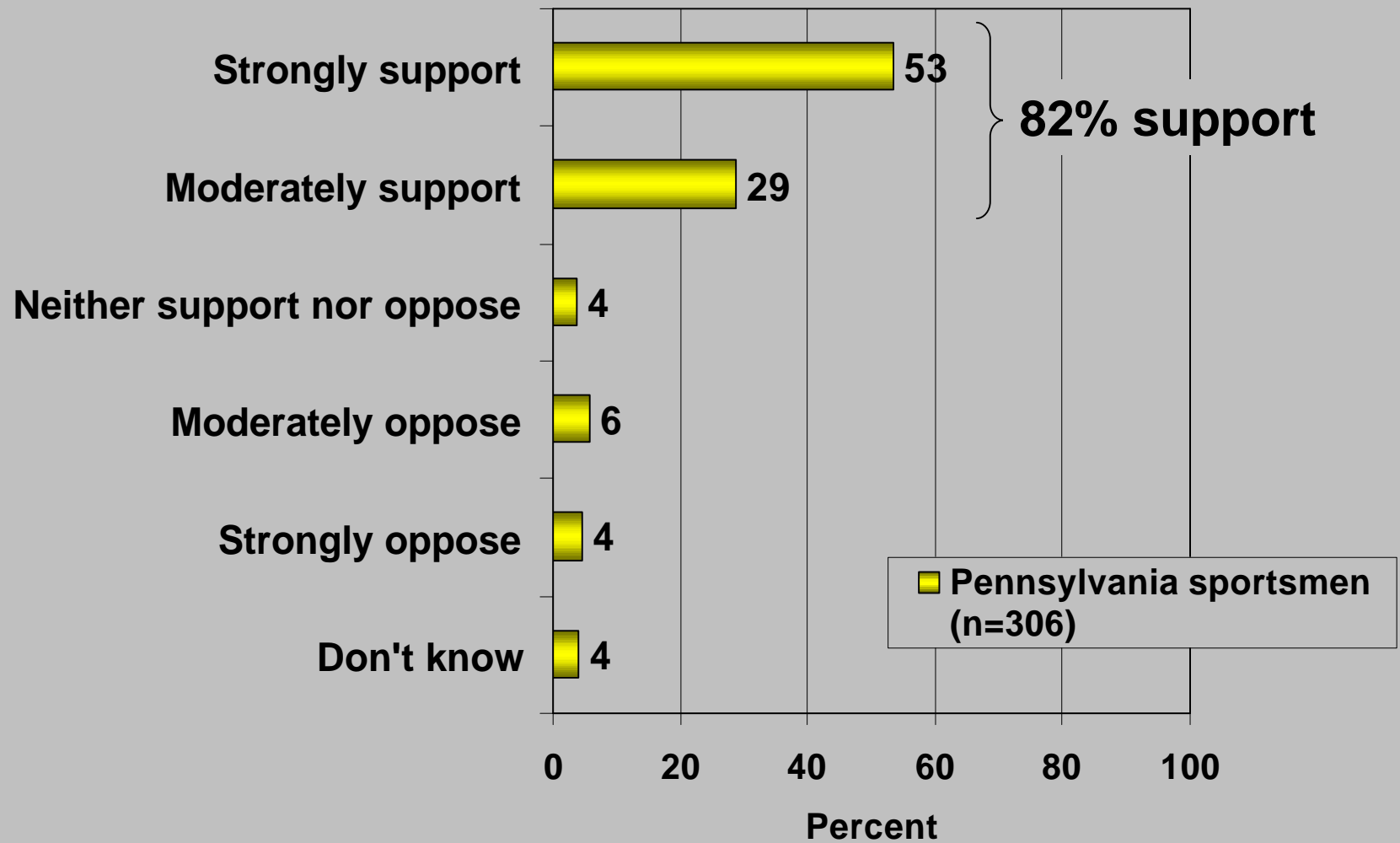
Is the country on the right track or the wrong track in meeting our national energy needs?



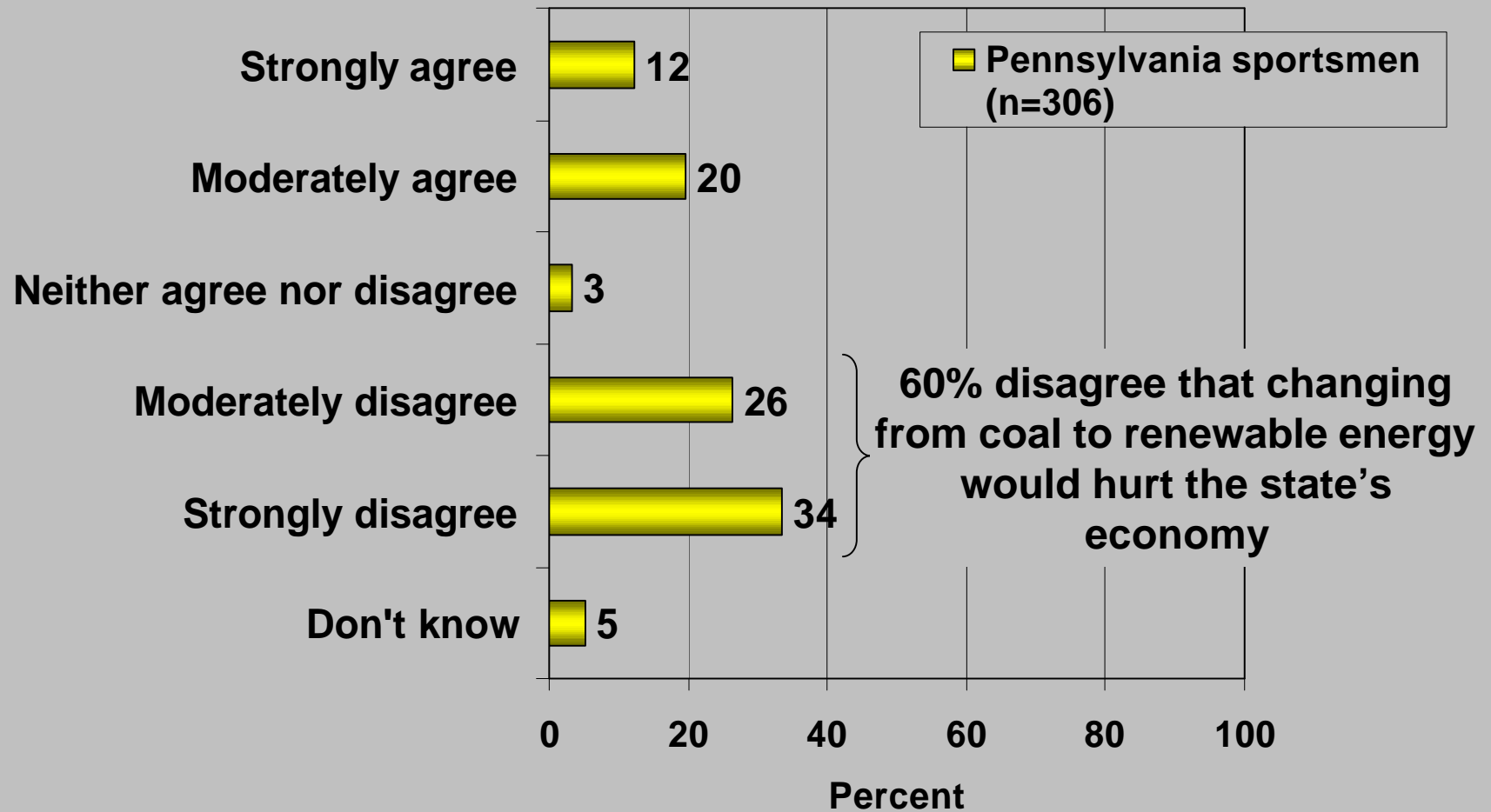
Which of the following do you think is the best way to address America's energy needs?



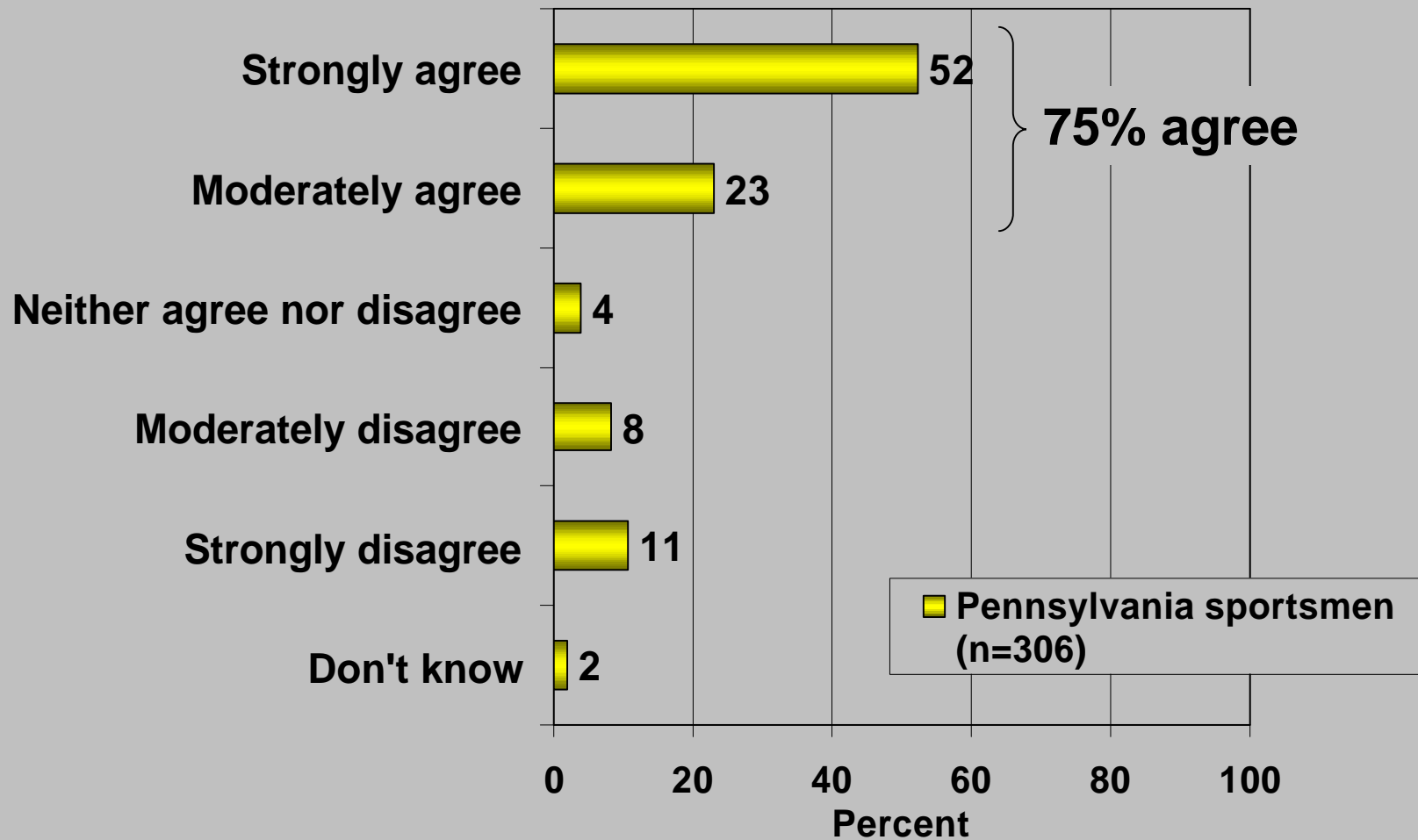
In general, do you support or oppose the development and use of wind energy in Pennsylvania?



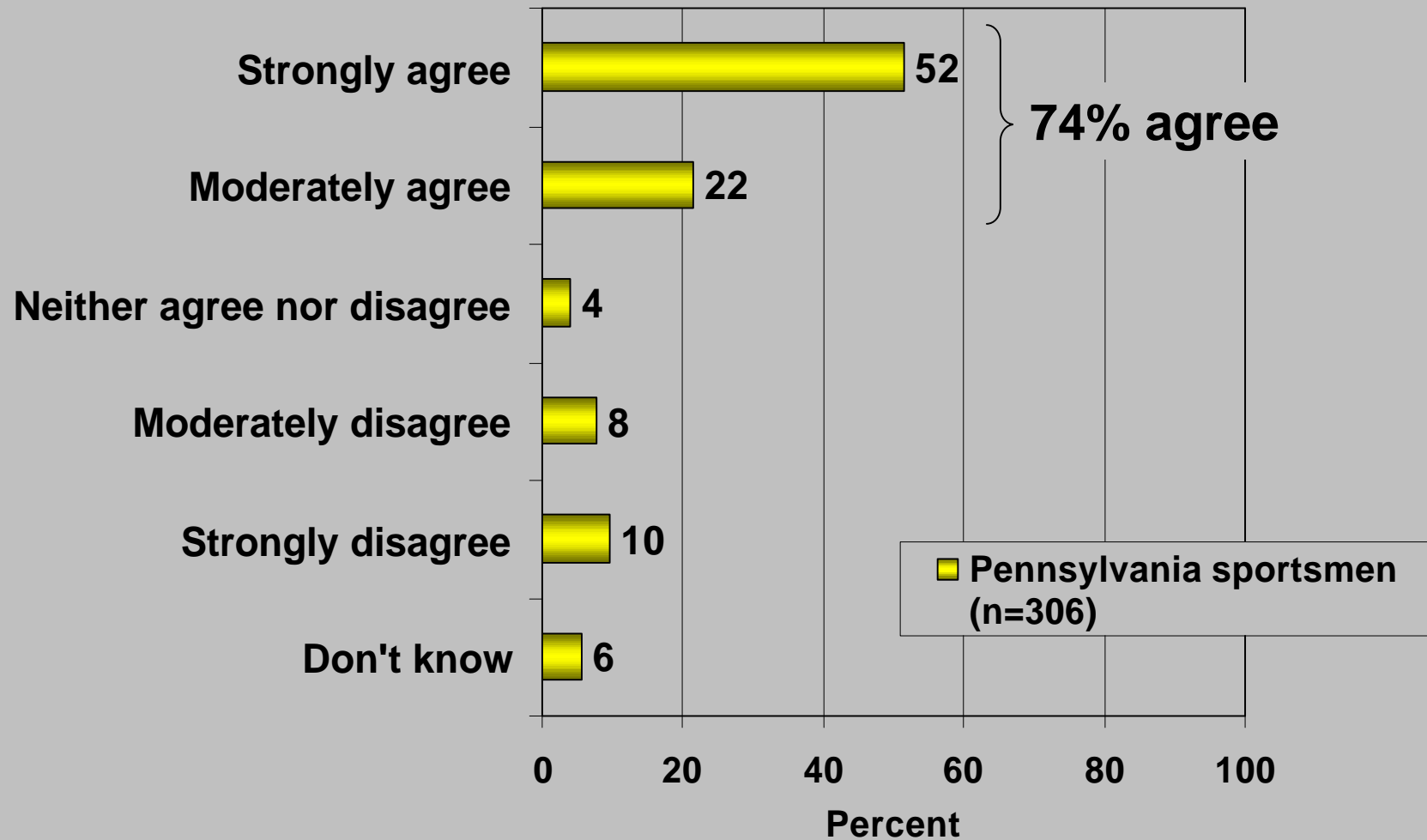

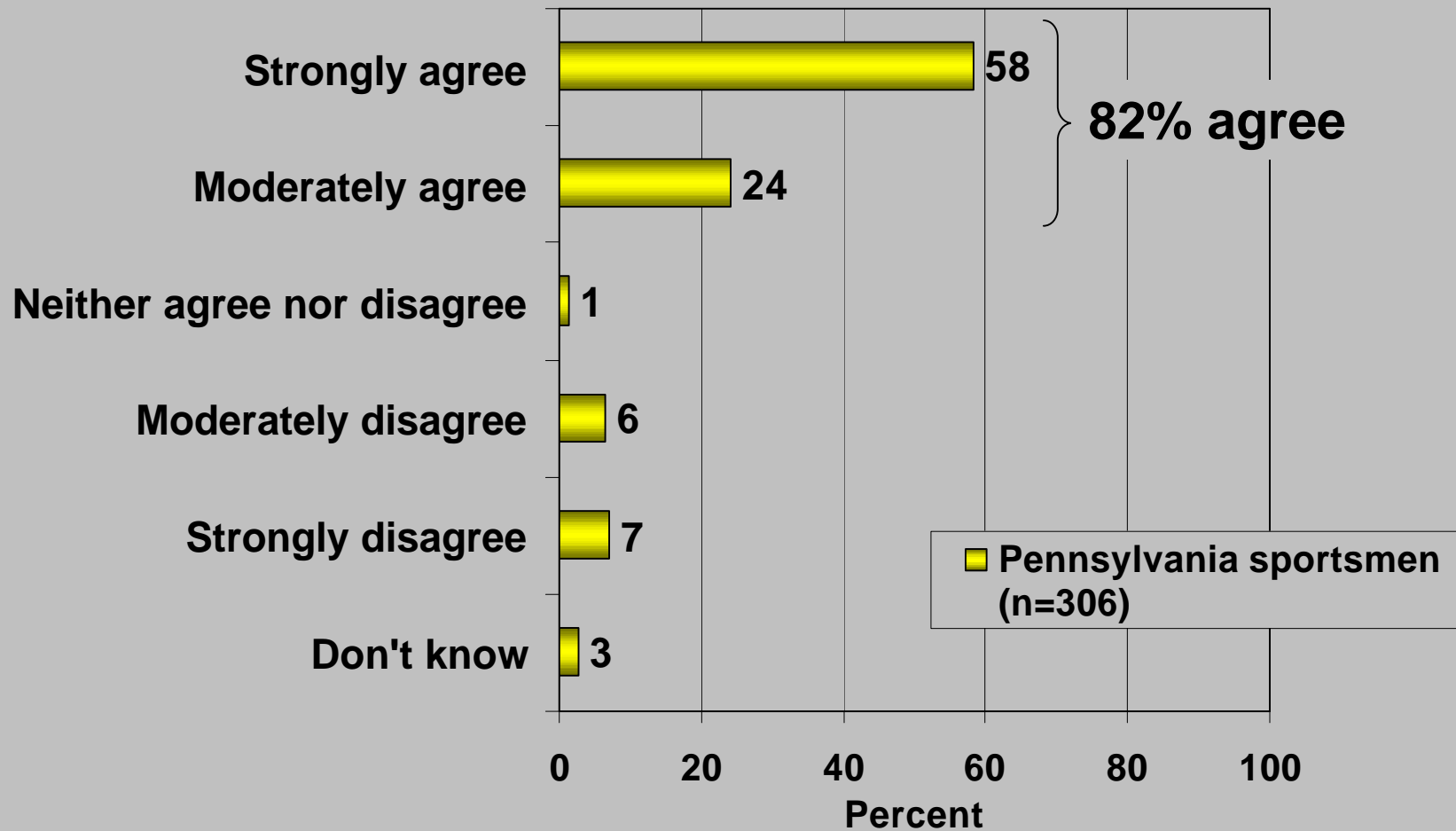
Legislation to address global warming should include funding to protect fish, wildlife, and their habitat from the impacts of global warming. (Do you agree or disagree with this statement?)
